5. Student Support and Progression

5.1 Contribution of IQAC in enhancing awareness about Student Support Services

The IQAC in consultation with the Governing Body and the Academic sub- committee sets out rules and regulations of the college annually. Students are informed through the prospectus, college website and notices about the various support services available in the college. Principal, senior teachers and staff members also address the students on the first day in college about various rules and regulations as well as facilities available to them. IQAC members along with the various subcommittees monitor the teaching learning and other needs of the students. Special attention is paid to the disputations/problems through Anti Ragging cell and Internal Complaint cell. Student mentoring in groups has been initiated in laboratory based subjects. Psychological counselling and health clinic for students was organised on a weekly basis.

- Class tests, mid-term tests and test examinations are held regularly.
- Slow learners are provided with remedial classes. Special attention is paid to slow learners from underprivileged backgrounds, like SC, ST and OBC.
- Departmental meetings are held regularly to assess the students' progress and the authority is informed accordingly.
- Parent –teachers meetings are held by the Departments regularly. Guardians of students
 with inadequate attendance are called upon and informed accordingly. All these efforts are
 carried out under the leadership of the IQAC through the Academic sub-committee and
 HODs.



BEST PRACTICES

BEST PRACTICE 1

Atmospheric pollen and spores are well-known trigger of respiratory allergy and asthma and hence called environmental bio-pollutants. Keeping this in view, airborne allergenic pollen and fungal spore survey has been carried out with Burkard 7-day sampler (Burkard Manufacturing Co., U.K.) at the West Block in the college campus. The trapped pollen and spores are microscopically studied to form a local pollen-spore calendar. More than 36 pollen types and 24 fungal spores were recorded, among which some are allergenic. This is helpful to get idea about airborne allergen exposure. In addition, airborne particulate matter (PM10 and PM2.5) level is also being recorded and correlated with the respiratory health effect among industrial workers and local children using peak flow meter. The students of NSS unit of the college are involved with the study. Population health survey has been performed with questionnaire around the college campus, in the industrial area and slum area of Ashu Bose Lane.

BEST PRACTICE 2

Regular OPD clinic has been conducted in collaboration with Howrah Municipal Corporation for the students, staff and industrial workers outside college campus. In these OPD clinics, free medicines are distributed among patients after the health check-up by clinicians accompanied by pharmacist and sister nurse of HMC health department. Eye check-up had also been carried out for the residents of nearby industrial area by NSS unit. On World Environment Day, plantlets were distributed in the locality outside the campus, whose growth status is regularly monitored by the students of the college.
