Guidelines for Preparation of Manuscript

The Manuscript should be typed, 1.15-spaced on standard-sized – A 4 size paper (8.25" x 11.75") with 1" margins on all sides. Authors should take care over the fonts which are used in the document, including fonts within graphics.

[Calibri (body)-16, upper case, bold, centre]

Author(s) Name(s)

[Calibri(body)-16, upper lower, bold, centre]

Author Affiliation(s): [Calibri(body)-11, italics, centre]

Corresponding author should have an asterisk sign () if possible, after the corresponding author's name.*

Abstract: *The abstract is to be in fully-justified italicized text as it is here, below the author information. Use the word "Abstract" as the title, in 12-point Times New Roman, boldface type, initially capitalized. The abstract is to be in 12-point, 1.15-spaced type. Leave a blank lines after the abstract, text of the manuscripts must be written in English.*

Key words: We would like to encourage you to list your keywords in this section (Times New Roman-12)

Headings of main text

The main text of the manuscript has to be divided into headings like Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion, Acknowledgements, References, etc. These headings have to be appeared in Calibri(body) 14 point, bold and centered position. The subheadings have to be sequenced with Arabic numeral order.

Second-order headings (Sub-heading)

As in this heading, they should be Times New Roman 11-point boldface, initially capitalized, flush left,

with one blank line before, and one after.

Main text

The text should be in times New Roman – 11, fully justified with 1.15 spacing. The references have to be sited in Arabic numerical, according to their serial of appearance in text, within third bracket like this [1].

Tables

Author has to place tables as close as possible to the text they refer to and aligned centre. A table has to be given a number (*e.g.*, **Table 1. Sample Datasheet with Attributes in Linguistic Term**) it should be numbered consecutively.

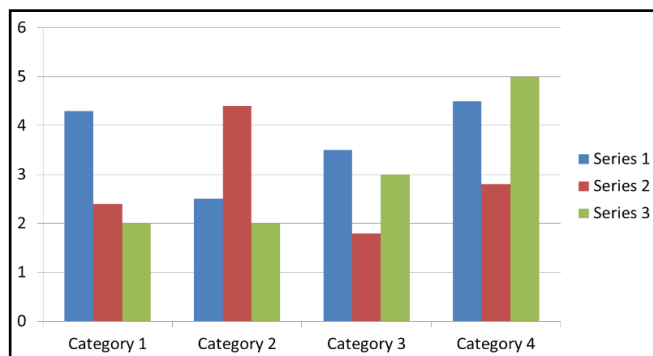

Figures

Author has to place figures as close as possible to the text they refer to and aligned centre. Photos, graphs, charts or diagram should be labelled Figure (not abbreviated) and appear below the figure and assigned a number consecutively. The label and title should be in line with the figure number (*e.g.*, **Figure 1. Location Error Rate of Three Schemes**), it should be uniform fonts, Minimum image dimensions are 6 cm (2.3622 in) wide by 6 cm (2.3622 in) high.

Equations

Including symbols and equations in the text, the variable name and style must be consistent with

those in the equations. Equations should be indented at the left margin and numbered at the right margin, equation number is enclosed with open and close parenthesis () Time New Roman in style and 11pt font size. Define all symbols the first time they are used. All equation symbols must be defined in a clear and understandable way. For Example:

$$\frac{dS}{dt} = v_4 - (v_1 + v_2 + v_3)$$

Acknowledgements

Acknowledgements should be brief and placed at the end of the text before the references.

References

The text of the references will be in Times New Roman 11 point, italicized, justified with 1.15 spacing. The references should be listed numerically according to their serial appearance in the text of the manuscript as following:
